## **Long Methodology Statement**

Effective sample size after weighting applied: 1575

Margin of error associated with effective sample size: ±2.5

Variables used in weighting Weighting method used: Age x gender x location, Age x

education, Rim weighting

**Source of online sample:** Selected from previously recruited online panels of research

participants to fill quotas loosely based on weighting frame and past vote

**Positioning of voting intention questions in questionnaire?** Immediately after demographics

**2PP calculation method:** Calculated according to preferences flows at previous elections **How were undecided voters handled for voting intention?** Undecided respondents who answered "don't know" were asked a leaner question which also included a "don't know" option. Those who answered don't know were excluded from published voting intention figures but not from the survey. 8% were thus excluded from published voting intention figures.

How were undecided voters handled for the Voice? Undecided respondents who answered "don't know" were asked a leaner question which also included a "don't know" option. Those who answered don't know were included in published voting intention figures, so published figures are not directly comparable to actual results.

**Additional Method Details.** Demographics and state breakouts were based on an aggregate of this poll and the previous poll, and smaller States were oversampled to ensure larger sample sizes, with 764 in NSW, 759 in VIC, 802 in QLD, 570 in SA, 603 in WA and 303 in TAS. To produce aggregate figures the sample was weighted to national proportions. The theoretical margins of error for states range from  $\pm$  3.7. to  $\pm$  7.5.
